## WHAT DO YOU NEED TO KNOW TO BE ${ }^{2}$ SUCCESSFUL IN HIGH SCHOOL......AND BEYOND

- High School credits
- Promotion Requirements
- Graduation Requirements

- Student Responsibilities in the Classroom (Attendance, Study Skills, Make up Work, Talking to your teacher)


## WHAT ARE HIGH SCHOOL CREDITS?

- You will earn credit for every course that you take during high school
- At LCHS, you will earn .5 credit each semester
- Grades (report cards) are given every 9 weeks. Each 9 weeks is half of your semester average.
- You can earn . 5 credit for one semester, and not .5 credit for the next semester
- You NEED the FULL CREDIT
- If you fail a semester, then you will need to make that up in order to meet graduation requirements.


## PROMOTION REQUIREMENTS

- Must have 5 credits after first year to be a sophomore
- Must have 11 credits after second year to be a junior
- Must have 17 credits after third year to be a senior
- Must have 23 credits to graduate


# GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS 

## ENGLISH

- Four years (or credits) of English are required
- $9^{\text {th }}$ Lit
- $10^{\text {th }}$ Lit
- $11^{\text {th }}$ Lit (Must be American Lit)
- $12^{\text {th }}$ Lit
- Dual enrollment literature can substitute


## MATH

- Four years (credits) of Math are required - Algebra I
- Geometry
- Algebra II
- $4^{\text {th }}$ math - there are several options
- PreCalculus
- Adv. Math Decision Making
- Math of Finance
- Dual enrollment


## SCIENCE

- Four years (or credits) of Science are required
- Physical Science or Physics
- Biology
- Environmental Science or Chemistry
- $4^{\text {th }}$ Science - there are many choices
- Some examples: Forensic Science, Animal Science, Plant Science, etc.
- Be careful to choose courses that meet four year college admissions requirements if that's your plan


## SOCIAL STUDIES

- Three credits of Social Studies are required
-1⁄22 credit of Citizenship
-1/2 credit of Economics
- World History
- US History
- Also required
- $1 / 2$ credit of Health
- $1 / 2$ credit of Personal Fitness
- 3 years of NJROTC will satisfy this requirement


## ELECTIVES

- 7 credits of Electives are required
- 3 credits must come from Fine Arts, OR Foreign Language, OR CTAE
- Fine Arts examples: Band, Chorus, Drama, Art
- CTAE examples: Construction, Healthcare, Business, etc.
- Foreign Language: Spanish.
- Any combination of these will meet this requirement
- 4 additional credits can come from any area


## SOME THINGS TO CONSIDER...

- Students who wish to attend a University of Georgia Institution need to complete 2 years of the same foreign language
- Students who are not planning to attend college, or who plan to attend a Technical college may benefit from pursuing a pathway


## WHAT'S A GPA AND WHO CARES?

$A=4.0(90-100) \quad B=3.0(80-89)$
$C=2.0(70-79) \quad F=0 \quad(0-69)$

- Types of GPA - Cumulative (un-weighted), Academic (weighted), HOPE
- Determines class rank (Academic)
- Determines eligibility for HOPE Scholarship
- LCHS adds . 5 point for Honors/Dual Enrollment and 1.0 point for AP (HOPE does not weight the same)
- What do colleges look at?


## HOW DO I CALCULATE MY GPA?

Step 1: Assign each grade a numeric value
$A=4 B=3 C=2 D=1 F=0$

* Remember Honors/AP courses receive additional weight

Step 2: Multiply the numeric point value by the units of credit attempted
Step 3: Total the values from step 2 \& divide by the total number of courses

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## COLLEGE GPA REQUIREMENTS

- High school GPA requirements for an incoming freshman applicant are different depending on which institution is evaluating an application. For many lvy League, Big Ten, and state universities, for instance, the majority of incoming freshman students have a high school GPA of 3.75 or higher and reguire a minimum of a 3.0 average. These types of universifies, generally, require an applicant to have graduated in the top quarter of his or her class.
- Smaller universities are likely to view a 3.0 average as the baseline for first round applicant choices, with students who have grade point averages between a 2.5 or higher also being Tikely to gain acceptance. Other universities might only require a 2.0, and consider other factors.
- Many community colleges or technical colleges have no entrance requirement or only require a high school diploma or GED for admission.


## WHERE WILL YOUR GPA TAKE YOU?

| College/University | Minimum GPA requirement |
| :--- | :--- |
| Albany State University | 2.5 |
| Georgia Southern | 2.6 |
| Georgia Southwestern | 2.4 |
| Georgia State | 3.0 |
| Kennesaw State University | 2.6 |

- Midpoint GPA for UGA first year students is 4.0-4.44 (www.uga.edu, 09/2021)
- Average GPA for GA Tech first year students is 4.2 (www.gatech.edu, 09/2021)

UGA/ GA Tech - "...receives a larger number of applications from academically qualified students than the institution has the capacity to admit and enroll. Consequently, some highly qualified applicants with strong academic credentials may not be extended an offer of admission. ... utilizes a holistic review process which includes the consideration of additional factors such as recommendations, essays, community involvement, and interviews." (www.usg.edu, 09/2020)

## HOPING TO BE AN HONOR GRADUATE?

- Honor Graduates must have a 4.1 honor weight gpa
- Honors with Distinction graduates must have a 4.1 honor weight gpa and must have taken at least 6 honors classes including at least 1 AP class


## REMEMBER.....

- If you fail a course, it will have to be repeated
- Failing grades STAY on your transcript
- Higher grades make your GPA better...... so STUDY and be at school EVERY DAY


## TESTING

- Students will take a Georgia Milestones Assessment (Georgia Milestones) end-of-course assessment at the end of the year for the following courses
- Biology
- Algebra I
- US History
- $11^{\text {th }}$ Literature
- Tests will include constructed responses items, performance tasks, and selected responses items
- These tests count as 20\% of your final average - very important!!!


## HOPE SCHOLARSHIP

- For students who are Georgia residents and are graduating from a Georgia high school
- Pays a percentage of tuition at colleges in Georgia
- Percentages change every year - can be found at www.gafutures.org


## HOW DO I QUALIFY FOR THE HOPE SCHOLARSHIP???

- Must have a 3.0 gpa in academic classes
- HOPE determines your gpa
- Your high school does not determine your HOPE gpa
- New Rigor Requirements - 4 rigor courses
- Does not have to be AP/Honors courses

- REMEMBER - Your gpa for HOPE eligibility starts NOW!


## HOPE, CONT

- Zell Miller Scholarship - 3.7 gpa, and 1200 on SAT or 26 on ACT
- Pays 100\% of tuition
- Rigor Requirements must be met
- HOPE Grant - for Technical Colleges in Georgia
- No initial gpa requirement upon graduation
- Must maintain 2.0 in college


## DUAL ENROLLMENT

- Opportunities now limited to $11^{\text {th }}$ and $12^{\text {th }}$ grade students
- Need to take the SAT or ACT or Accuplacer by December of your sophomore year

## WHAT NOT TO DO IN HIGH SCHOOL

- Miss school
- Turn notes in to the front office within 3 days when absent!!
- Attendance policy - missing more than 10 days means you will not earn credit in that class
- Come late to class
- Expect teachers or parents/guardians to be responsible for your work
- Fail to complete your work
- Not pay attention in class
- Cheat - on purpose or by accident
- Earn zeroes - they will kill you average very quickly
